Edi Simčić is from SLOVENIA! He is just across the North Eastern Border of Italy in a Region called Goriška Brda which is just a couple of Football Fields from Italy. This area used to be part of Italy until the end of WWII. "Sivi Pinot" is Slovene (The Language of Slovenia) for Pinot Grigio. Edi uses a bit of Newer Wood in his wines, so they almost are a mixture of the French and Italian Styles. The bouquet is Toasty and Smoky with bits of White Peach and Apricot. The Palate is Rich and Lightly Apple Driven and has a Touch of Cream but still holds impressive Acidity. It is Slightly Spicy in the Finish with a note of Chenin Blanc style Minerality that reminds me of Savennières. This is definitely a Country, Producer and Wine to Watch. Be Careful... Drinking this wine may change the way you think about wine.

These are the farmer Champagnes from the people that live on the land and sweat into the earth. When you purchase Champagne from a Grower, **you support the people that live with the Earth.** With a Grower (look for the "RM" on the bottle), you feed farmers.

The **Quality to Price Ratio is the Best for any Champagne.** Many Growers are using only Premier or 1er ("B" Grade) and Grand Cru ("A" Grade) Fruit, from vineyards that they *own*, where a Négociant purchases mostly Village ("C" Grade), some Premier and a tiny bit of Grand Cru Fruit. For the same money or even a few dollars less you can taste the work of artisans who have captured a vinous snap shot of the vintage.

Why Dry Rosé?

A **Dry Rosé** is the First Flower of Spring in the World of Wine. It is the first wine to be released from the previous year's harvest. It tempts and teases us to relax in the afternoon and balmy evenings during our long summers.

A True Rosé is made from juice of red grapes that have only flirted with contact of the skins from whence it came. Contact with the skins gives the wine its delightful color. **Dry Rosé** is a way to enjoy characteristics of red wine without having to be weighted down by Wood and Tannin. It is a **half step between Red and White Wine**.

It is **one of the most flexible warm weather wines**. It can accompany everything from the classic picnic to grilled salmon or stand on its own merits on warm afternoons.

Think Pink. Drink Pink.

Pink. It is the NEW Pink!

Why Women Winemakers?

Women Winemakers (look for the “**W**” on the list) have a different touch when it comes to making wine. They **understand subtlety**.

There is a Woman behind many of the great wines we drink every day. Some of the wines you may already know, others may surprise you. Take for example the wines of Dalla Valle, Spottswoode, Araujo, Stag’s Leap Wine Cellars, Turley, Far Niente and Viader just to name a few. Any sound familiar?

I find that Women are not out to place an ego signature on their wines and create the biggest and most intense point scoring, fruit-bomb monster that is possible. There is generally a less intensive use of wood, and the tannins are supple and softer. Many women are more aware of the “Terroir” of the vineyard and do not abuse it in the winemaking process.

There is an understated elegance in the bottle. The wines they touch sing of their own accord.

To read about wine is to know. To taste is to understand.

Why Sidre (Cider)?

When life allows one to experience anything new, it is always best to start with the greatest example. It is the easiest way to appreciate any new experience.

These Sidre are made by Eric Bordelet, who used to be the Sommelier at L'Arpège, which is a Michelin 3 Star Restaurant in the Diplomatic Quarter of Paris. He was inspired to return to his native Normandy and make Cider by none other than **Didier Dagueneau**, a World Renown Master of Sauvignon Blanc from Pouilly-sur-Loire (this is a BIG deal for the cork dorks). **These Sidre are the most pure representations of Apples and Pears that you can get without traveling to Normandy and biting into the fruit yourself.** On the Palate you find the flesh of the fruit, the juice, the tannin from the skins and seeds ... so delicate, so true. And such Minerality! It is a joy to drink. And why not? They are 4% Alcohol by Volume.

The 20 Varieties of Apple and 14 Varieties of Pear Trees are up to 300 Years Old (You read that correctly). Yes, 300 years old. They have never seen chemical pesticides or fertilizers. They are maintained with Biodynamic Farming for the most pure example of what these majestic trees have to offer. These Apple and Pear Orchards are in Cahrchigné, Normandy, which is just West of Paris, about 2 hours North of the Loire Valley and about the same distance from the English Channel.

Why Biodynamie/Biodynamica/Biodynamics?

A friend once told me, that if you drop a pebble in a pond the ripples reach out and touch all the way to the edge and then they return inward to the source. Everything you touch touches you. Think about what you eat and drink. It matters. It becomes a part of you.

Biodynamie, also known as Biodynamics, (look for the “**B**”) is a natural agricultural process that works with the rhythms of the earth. It uses small amounts of preparations, applied in sync with the natural cycles of the earth and moon, to stimulate the earth’s own energies and processes. I admit that the methodology is almost a bullet-train beyond weird, but, when you taste the results, it is undeniable. Some of the world’s greatest Domaines espouse the methods and create the most profound wines. With the number of advocates growing with every harvest, who is to say that Biodynamie is wrong?

The Biodynamy Producers believe that all living things are linked in a sort of symbiotic synchronicity. A winemaker told me that ‘the earth gives him the grapes’. What do we in turn give to the earth?

What I would drink if I sat in your seat and Why:

NV Billiot Grand Cru Brut Réserve (Ambonnay, Champagne) 57.

This is a real agricultural product. Champagne from Henri Billiot, who is a farmer in the Montagne de Reims. Instead of Vegetables, he just happens to grow Pinot Noir and Chardonnay for Champagne in one of the greatest vineyard sites (Grand Cru). He is a grower-producer (he owns all of his own fruit). The wine is Generous, Seductive, Elegant and even Bold, Powerful and Hedonistic, but not flabby. It has basket loads of substance. I dare you to deny it as it demands you palate's attention.

2006 Paolo Bea "Santa Chiara" (Umbria, Italia) 59.

Santa Chiara is a blend of 5 Grapes: Grechetto (of Orvieto Fame), Malvasia, Chardonnay, Sauvignon and Garganega (which gives us Soave). It is fermented without Temperature Control with Yeasts Naturally occurring on the grape. The Wine is like a Hippy Chick in a Blouse of Many Colors. It is a Revelation in the glass. It is kinda trippy, as it can be cloudy; the color migrates from slight Orange, Ochre to Salmon-Skin Pink hues. This is what it could have been like in the 15th Century. A True Expression of the Vine, Soil and Year.

2006 Dom. Marcel Lapierre Morgon Cru Beaujolais (Burgundy) 34.

Morgon, one of only 10 Crus (Renown Areas for Growing Wine) in Beaujolais, is comprised of Gamay and not Pinot Noir. Morgon comes from Mont du Py which is covered in Granite Soils (Which makes the wine seem more similar to Northern Rhône than Burgundy) and a block of Marcel's 45 year old vines. It yields notes of Graphite, Juicy Plum and Black Cherry, finishing with notes of Crunchy Black Granite. There is *No Sulphur Added* to this wine as Marcel and his Son Mathieu care about what is in your glass. This is one of the Greatest Examples of Beaujolais.

2005 Jorge Ordonez No.2 "Victoria" (Málaga, España) 10gls/51btl

One of the many brilliant wines graced by the hand of Robert Kracher, who was arguably one of the greatest dessert wine specialists in the world, made for Spanish Importer Jorge Ordonez. In this region the grapes are dried (baked really) in direct sunlight which makes quick raisins and concentrates the residual sugars. The wine gives Fruit Cocktail, Mandarin Orange Rind, and Wild Meadow Flowers. It is Viscous without being syrupy sweet.

The Wine List is like a wave in the Ocean. These are the seventh waves.

Why Serpico?

"Serpico", whose name comes from the tiny village where the winery is located called Sorbo Serpico, hails from Campania, which is the shin of Italy's boot (just North of the Amalfi Coast), in the Appellation of Taurasi, which is known as the "Barolo of the South" and is famous for its Volcanic Soils (remember Pompei?) that have a bit of Clay and Silt in them. Aglianico is the grape of "Serpico" and Taurasi, and may have been brought by the Phoenicians several THOUSAND years ago. The Ancient Greeks called Campania "Enotria" or "The Land of Wine", and it is the homeland for many varietals that may have originated with them. The Ancient Roman Scholars and Poets like Virgil, Horace, Pliny the Elder and Pliny the Younger revered the wines and mentioned them frequently in their works.

The Wine

2003 Feudi di San Gregorio Aglianico Irpina "Serpico" 85.

With Decanting, the Palate gives notes of Tar, Roasted Coffee, Cherry Preserve, Cocoa, hints of Licorice, Brandied Fruit, Blackberry Bramble and Rose Petals. It is a joy to drink with Beef Short Ribs, Venison, Roasted Rabbit, Grilled Ribeye or anything cooked by Confit.
